Cemeteries Exhumation

Purpose

To provide advice on the exhumation of human remains from trust land for cemetery purposes.

Rationale

Exhumations are normally dealt with in terms of local laws under the *Local Government Act 2009*. Where the local government is the trustee of trust land for cemetery purposes and does not have a local law, Councils may approve exhumations under the Land Act (Ministerial) Delegation Local Government (No 1) 2013.

Policy

A request for approval to exhume a body from a cemetery will be considered provided the remains have been interred for a period of at least 12 months from the date of initial burial.

However, special consideration will be given to requests to exhume remains in the first 12 months of burial where:

- extenuating circumstances exist;
- it is proposed to reinter the remains in a new burial plot; and
- evidence is provided that there will be no health risk as certified by Queensland Health.

Approval for exhumation of remains for reinterment in a new burial plot will be considered upon lodgement of:

- written confirmation from a recognised Undertaker that they are prepared to carry out the exhumation,
- the written consent to the proposed exhumation by the nearest living relative to the deceased,
- a certified copy of the Death Certificate, and
- details of the new burial place where reinterment is to take place.

Ministerial approval will not be given for exhumation of remains for subsequent cremation purposes prior to expiry of a 12 month period from date of initial burial.

Approval for authorising exhumation of remains for cremation purposes will be considered upon lodgement of:

- written confirmation from a recognised Undertaker that they are prepared to carry out the exhumation,
- the written consent to the proposed exhumation by the nearest living relative to the deceased,
- a certified copy of the Death Certificate,
- a completed declaration in accordance with the provisions of the *Cremations Act 2003* and its Regulations, and
- the written approval of Queensland Health, if required.

Where the remains are being exhumed for cremation purposes, approval will be subject to compliance with all relevant State/Territory legislation and regulations.

Exhumation requests by the Coroner or for any scientific purposes will be referred to the Attorney-General.

Approvals will be subject to any requirements, by-laws and/or regulations of the local government.
